

Everest Insurance (Ireland), DAC ("EIID") hereby informs the public of the creation of fraudulent documents purporting to be surety policies issued by EIID. These documents are not legitimate surety policies, and EIID has had no role in creating them. An example of one of these fraudulent documents can be found [Sample Fraudulent Document](#).

Among the significant indicators of fraud in at least one document discovered by EIID are, the following:

- **Incorrect Company Name:** The documents refer to "Everest Insurance Company" instead of the correct legal entity, "Everest Insurance (Ireland), DAC."
- **Invalid Contact Information:** The email address provided in the document, [everestinsurance@uaipect.it](mailto:everestinsurance@uaipect.it), is not a legitimate domain name used by or in any way associated with EIID or any affiliate of EIID or EIID's ultimate parent company, Everest Group, Ltd. (Bermuda).

EIID identified similar documents fraudulently purporting to be EIID policies in 2023.

EIID has reported both the recent discovery of fraudulent documents, as well as the incident discovered in 2023, to the Istituto per la Vigilanza sulle Assicurazioni (IVASS) and to its regulator, the Central Bank of Ireland.
